CURB WATER POLLUTION

Start in Your Own Back Yard

- ◆ Set mower height to 3 inches or higher.
- ◆ Retain grass clippings and chopped leaves onsite.
- ◆ Keep clippings/leaves out of streams, drains & off the street.
- ◆ Fertilizers for your lawn . . .do you need them?
- ◆ Test your soil, consult a professional or certified applicator.
- ◆ Maximize the slow-release nitrogen in your fertilizer.
- ◆ Start with low amounts or fewer applications.
- ◆ Apply only during the growing season and check the weather.
- ◆ Do not fertilize/use pesticides within 15-20' of a stream.
- ◆ Sweep granulated chemicals back onto your lawn.
- ◆ Garden fertilizer alternatives include compost/manure.

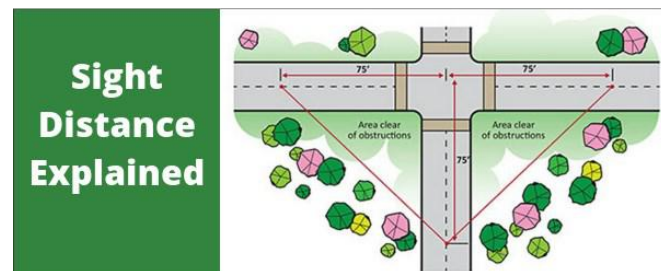
Residents shall comply with Ordinance 2 of 1996, which requires properties to be identified with a number placed to clearly identify the location, in an effort to assist the emergency services in locating you.

Animals

As per Dickinson Township Zoning Ordinance Chapter 205-34D: To have farm animals on your property, you must meet the minimum setback of 100' from all property lines for the housing of the animals and storage of their waste.

YARD and LOT REGULATIONS

As per Dickinson Township Zoning Ordinance Chapter 205-21A: Corner Lots: No obstruction to vision exceeding 30" in height above street level shall be erected or maintained within a 100' clear sight triangle formed by the centerline of intersecting streets. Due to safety concerns this could cause when pulling out of intersections, this Ordinance will be enforced.

Stuart & Lindenwood Parks

Plans are to place a restroom/storage building and drill a well at Stuart Park in 2020.

The Park & Recreation Board is looking at the possibilities of developing Lindenwood Park, which is located on N. Dickinson School Road. A comprehensive site design plan must be completed first, and then phasing for development will be discussed. The Board has been granted a Land Partnership Grant from Cumberland County to assist with the financial responsibility. Planning will begin in June 2020 and is expected to be completed by the end of 2021. Residents are encouraged to share input about interests in what amenities should be considered.

As warmer weather approaches, there is typically an uptick of vehicle break-ins. Remember to keep valuables out of sight, and your car doors locked. We give every effort to find those responsible, not all crimes can be solved.

As the income tax deadline nears, scammers will call and pretend to be from the IRS, demanding payment. No legitimate agency will ask for payment over the phone, payment via gift cards, nor payment through services like Western Union. Don't make yourself an easy victim. If it sounds suspicious or you have doubt, go with your instinct.

Municipal Recycling Program

Each year the Township applies for an Act 101 Recycling Performance Grant through the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). The grants are based on the success of the Township's recycling efforts, the weight of DEP approved materials recycled and the Township population. The grant can increase as the Township's recycling efforts increase. All residents are encouraged to recycle. Acceptable items include newsprint; paper; cardboard; aluminum cans; amber, clear, and green glass; and various types of plastics.



The Township received \$14,190. for its recycling efforts in 2017.

Septic Pumping/Inspection Reminder

The Township staff has forwarded reminders to residents requiring septic pumping in 2020. It is required that every owner of an individual sewage system have septage or other solids removed from the treatment tank at least once every 3 years. Proof of pumping and/or inspection shall be provided by the owner of the individual system within 30 days of the date of service to the Township, along with the required \$10 administrative fee, which helps to offset administrative costs. Please visit www.dickinsontownship.org for more information, including required forms and a list of approved septic haulers.

The alternative is to have a Registered Septic Hauler or Inspection Company perform a "sludge test" to verify there is no more than 1/3 of the capacity of the tank filled with solids. If this is the case, you will receive a waiver from the pumping requirements until the next 3 year cycle. A report must be submitted for the solids inspection, along with the \$10 administrative fee.

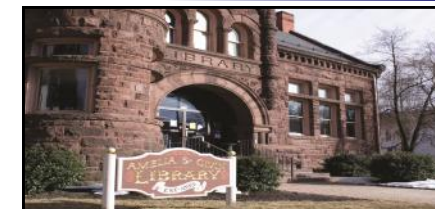
