

CLEAR SIGHT TRIANGLES

As per Dickinson Township Zoning Ordinance Chapter 205-22A: Corner Lots: No obstruction to vision exceeding 30" in height above street level shall be erected or maintained within a 100' clear sight triangle formed by the centerline of intersecting streets. Due to the safety concerns this could cause when pulling out of intersections, this Ordinance will be enforced.

Parks & Recreation News -

The Dickinson Township Parks & Recreation Committee continues to work on the Site Development Plan for both Stuart and Lindenwood Parks. A Cumberland County Land Partnership grant was approved for this project and a Study Committee has held numerous meetings over the past year discussing future needs at both locations. Several public meetings were held to receive resident input as well. A final site plan will soon be presented to the Board of Supervisors for approval, which will include a proposed development schedule for both parks, a phasing plan, and a cost analysis. Once an approved Site Development Plan for the two parks is in place, the Township will be in a position to apply for additional funding opportunities to assist in accomplishing the goals as outlined in the Site Plan. A time frame for completion will be contingent upon the availability of funding through grants, private contributions, township budgets and community involvement and support. A well has been installed at Stuart Park and a Restroom Building will be constructed.

* * * R E M I N D E R * * *

Driveway permits are required for all new driveways and for any existing driveway that is being resurfaced if it connects to a public road. These driveways must be constructed to allow water to drain off before entering onto a roadway. Permits must be obtained before any work can begin.

Comprehensive Plan Update

The Planning Commission has done a full rewrite and has significantly reduced the size of the document. They have removed a lot of redundant information and organized the document so that it is easier to read. They will be finishing up their review within the next few months at which time they will send it to the Board of Supervisors for their review and adoption.



Septic Pumping/Inspection Reminder

The Township staff has forwarded the second pumping reminders of the year in September to residents who still need their septic systems pumped in 2021. It is required that every owner of an individual sewage system have septage or other solids removed from the treatment tank at least once every 3 years. Proof of pumping and/or inspection shall be provided by the owner of the individual system within 30 days of the date of service to the Township, along with the required \$10 septic inspection fee, which helps to offset administrative costs. Please visit www.dickinsontownship.org for more information, including required forms and a list of approved septic haulers.

The alternative is to have a Registered Septic Hauler or Inspection Company perform a "sludge test" to verify there is no more than 1/3 of the capacity of the tank filled with solids. If this is the case, you will receive a waiver from the pumping requirements until the next 3 year cycle. A report must be submitted for the solids inspection, along with the \$10 inspection fee.
