ORDINANCE NO. 2022-01

**AN ORDINANCE OF DICKINSON TOWNSHIP, CUMBERLAND COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AMENDING AND RESTATING CHAPTER 190 [VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC] OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR DICKINSON TOWNSHIP.**

**WHEREAS**, Dickinson Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania (“**Township**”) is a second class township duly organized and existing under the Second Class Township Code, 53 P.S. § 65101 *et seq* and

**WHEREAS**, the Township has created a Code of the Township (“**Code**”) codifying the Ordinances of the Township; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township adopted an ordinance to regulate vehicle operation and traffic within the Township as codified in Chapter 190 [Vehicles and Traffic] of the Code; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township now desires to adopt and enact the following to supplant and replace the current Chapter 190 [Vehicles and Traffic], as set forth in this Ordinance; and

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it ordained and enacted as follows:

**Section 1:** Chapter 190 [Vehicles and Traffic] is hereby replaced in its entirety by the amended Chapter 190 [Vehicles and Traffic] attached hereto as Exhibit A.

**Section 2:** All Ordinances of the Township, or sections of Ordinance, that are inconsistent with the provisions herein are hereby repealed.

**Section 3:** If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Board of Supervisors that this Ordinance

would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

**Section 4:** This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days following its enactment by the Board of Supervisors of Dickinson Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, as provided by law.

# Chapter 190

## Vehicles and Traffic

### Article I

#### General Regulations

#### § 190-1 Definitions and interpretation.

- A. Words and phrases, when used in this chapter, except for the specific terms defined below, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq., except that in this chapter the word "street" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway," and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.

#### EXEMPT VEHICLES

The following vehicles are exempt vehicles:

- Emergency vehicles.
- School buses operating on regular routes.
- Vehicles and combinations of governmental agencies and utilities or their contractors engaged in construction, maintenance or utility operations on or along a posted highway or in a location which can only be reached by a posted highway.
- Local traffic.

#### LOCAL TRAFFIC

Vehicles and combinations going to or coming from a residence, commercial or industrial establishment, or farm located on a posted highway or which can only be reached by a posted highway.

#### OVER-POSTED-WEIGHT VEHICLE

A vehicle or combination having a gross weight, including cargo, in excess of a posted weight limit, whether in excess of a per axle weight limit or a gross vehicle weight limit.

#### POSTED HIGHWAY

That portion of a highway restricted to weight limits.

#### POSTED WEIGHT LIMIT

The weight limit, including cargo, whether per axle or gross vehicle, restricted by ordinance and posted on the highway.

#### PUSHCART

A vehicle, including a pedalcycle, propelled solely by human power, and used or intended for use for the display, transport, exhibit or sale of goods, wares or merchandise.

#### TOWNSHIP

Dickinson Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania.

- B. In this article, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

**§ 190-2 Manner of adopting permanent traffic and parking regulations.**

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances or as parts of ordinances or as amendments to ordinances of the Township of Dickinson.

**§ 190-3 Temporary and emergency regulations.**

- A. The Board of Supervisors of Dickinson Township shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:
- (1) In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.
  - (2) In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.
- B. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Board of Supervisors in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation, or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign erected or posted to give notice of any such regulation, shall be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this article for a violation of such nature, and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this article, to a fine of not more than \$500 and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment in the Cumberland County Prison for not more than 10 days.

**§ 190-4 Experimental regulations.**

The Board of Supervisors of Dickinson Township may from time to time designate places upon and along the streets and alleys in the Township where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect, and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective just as if they had been specified in this article. No person shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation, prohibition or restriction, and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected or made by authority of this section. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of the section shall, upon conviction thereof before a District Justice, be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this article for a violation of such nature, and in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this article, to a fine of not more than \$500 and costs of prosecution and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment in the Cumberland County Prison for not more than five days; provided that the purpose of this section is to allow for the test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the Township relative to traffic and parking.

**§190-5 Traffic on streets closed or restricted for construction, maintenance or special events.**

- A. The Township shall have authority to close any street or specific part of a street to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion while construction or maintenance work is underway or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.
- B. The Township shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any street where

construction or maintenance work is underway and to station flagmen at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagman is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop, or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.

- C. Any person who violates any provision of this section, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$500 and costs.

**§ 190-6 Stop intersections established.**

- A. The following intersections are hereby established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are hereby confirmed if heretofore erected) in such a position as to face traffic in the direction or directions hereby indicated. All vehicles and tractors approaching any such intersection upon the first-named street, in the direction or directions hereby indicated in each case, shall come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering such intersection:

- B. Any operator of a vehicle who shall fail to come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering any such stop intersection, as hereinabove required, shall, upon conviction thereof before a District Justice, be sentenced to pay a fine of no more than \$500 and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment in the Cumberland County Prison for not more than three days.

**§ 190-7 Continuation of existing regulations.**

The provisions of this article, so far as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately prior to the enactment of this article, are intended as a continuation of such ordinances and not as new enactments. The provisions of this article shall not affect any act done or liability incurred, nor shall they affect any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted to enforce any of those repealed ordinances or regulations.

**§ 190-8 Authority of police officers.**

The officers of the Pennsylvania State Police are hereby authorized to direct traffic on the highways of the Township and at intersections thereof and to otherwise enforce the provisions of this chapter.

**§ 190-9 Authorization for use of speed-timing devices.**

- A. The Pennsylvania State Police are hereby authorized to use all speed-timing devices for the determination of speed of a motor vehicle as are approved or will be approved by the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 3368.
- B. This section authorizes the use of said devices upon all streets and highways within the Township, be they municipal, county or state highways, and does also hereby elect to exercise all powers granted to "local authorities" under the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 6101 et seq., as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.

## **Article II**

### **Weight Limits on Bridges**

#### **§ 190-10 Preamble and policy.**

The foregoing paragraphs or preamble are incorporated herein as the background and policy of this article.

#### **§ 190-11 Maximum weight limits established; violations and penalties; exemptions.**

A. Maximum weight limits for vehicles are hereby established for the following specified bridges:

- (1) Four bridges on Alexander Spring Road (T-469) between South Middleton Township line and Burnt House Road (T-542): 16,000 pounds maximum gross weight each.
- (2) One bridge on Shag Bark Road (T-480) between Alexander Spring Road (T-469) and L.R. 890 (Route 11): 16,000 pounds maximum gross weight.
- (5) Two bridges on Cold Springs Road (T-356) between Pine Road (SR 3006) and PA Forest and Water Ridge Road: 30,000 pounds maximum gross weight each.
- (7) One bridge on Fanus Road (T-532) between South Middleton Township line and Goodyear Road (SR 3010): 16,000 pounds maximum gross weight.

B. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any part of the foregoing enumerated bridges having a gross maximum weight in excess of that established by this article.

C. Any person operating a vehicle or combination upon a highway or bridge in violation of a prohibition or restriction imposed under this section is guilty of a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$75, except that any person convicted of operating a vehicle with a gross weight in excess of a posted weight shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$150 plus \$150 for each 500 pounds, or part thereof, in excess of 3,000 pounds over the maximum allowable weight.

D. The following uses shall be exempt from the weight units imposed hereby:

- (1) Local traffic: vehicles and combinations going to or coming from a residence, commercial or industrial establishment or farm which can only be reached by a posted bridge;
- (2) Emergency vehicles;
- (3) School buses operating on regular routes; and
- (4) Vehicles and combinations of governmental agencies and utilities or their contractors engaged in construction, maintenance or utility operations on or along a posted highway or in a location which can only be reached by a posted bridge.

#### **§ 190-12 Continuation of existing regulations.**

The provisions of this article, insofar as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this article, are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances

and regulations. Nothing in this article shall affect any act done or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any earlier ordinances or regulations repealed or superseded hereby.

### **Article III One-Way Streets**

**§ 190-13 Preamble and policy.**

The foregoing paragraphs or preamble are incorporated herein as the background and policy of this article.

**§ 190-14 One-way streets established; violations and penalties.**

- A. The following streets are hereby established as one-way streets in the direction indicated, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any one-way street other than in the direction established for traffic on that street.

- B. Any person who violates any provision of this section shall, upon conviction before a District Justice, be sentenced to pay a fine of no more than \$500.

**§ 190-15 Continuation of existing regulations.**

The provisions of this article, insofar as they are the same as those ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this article, are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances and regulations. Nothing in this article shall affect any act done or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any earlier ordinances or regulations repealed or superseded hereby.

### **Article IV Speed Limits**

**§ 190-16 Preamble and policy.**

The foregoing paragraphs or preamble are incorporated herein as the background and policy of this article.

**§ 190-17 Maximum speed limits established; violations and penalties.**

- A. Maximum speed limits for vehicles are hereby established for the following specified roads:

- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any part of a road where the foregoing maximum speed limits apply at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for said road or part of road.
- C. Upon conviction by a District Justice/District Judge, a person shall pay a fine in an amount consistent with the applicable fine set forth in the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code at the time of the violation.

### **§ 190-18 Requirement to drive vehicle at safe speed.**

The foregoing provisions shall not relieve the drivers of vehicles from complying with Section 3361 of said Vehicle Code which is incorporated herein and made a part of this article as follows: "No person shall drive a vehicle at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions and having regard to the actual and potential hazards then existing, nor at a speed greater than will permit the driver to bring his vehicle to a stop within the assured clear distance ahead. Consistent with the foregoing, every person shall drive at a safe and appropriate speed when approaching a crossing, when approaching and going around a curve, when approaching hill crest, when traveling upon any narrow or winding roadway and when special hazards exist with respect to pedestrians or other traffic, and reasons of weather or highway conditions."

### **§ 190-19 Continuation of existing regulations.**

The provisions of this article, insofar as they are the same as those ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this article, are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances and regulations. Nothing in this article shall affect any act done or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any earlier ordinances or regulations repealed or superseded hereby.

## **Article V Weight-Restricted Roads**

### **§ 190-20 Legislative intent.**

The background of this article and the legislative intention of the Board of Supervisors ("Board") in enacting it are as follows:

- A. The Township of Dickinson is a municipal township of the second class and, as such, is a "local authority" as that term is defined in Section 102 of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code (herein, "Vehicle

Code"), 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 102.

- B. Pursuant to Sections 6102(b) and 6109(a)(7) of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 6102(b) and 6109(a)(7), local authorities are empowered to, inter alia, impose restrictions on the weight of vehicles operated on local roads.
- C. Pursuant to Sections 4902(a) and (b) of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 4902(a) and (b), the Board is empowered to impose restrictions on vehicle weight whenever a road, or portion of a road, may be seriously damaged by the use or the movement of vehicles exceeding a certain weight, or when the use of such vehicles would render traffic conditions unsafe.
- D. Pursuant to Sections 6105 and 6109(e) of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 6105 and 6109(e), prior to imposition of such restrictions, the Township Engineer must conduct a study in conformity with regulations imposed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Transportation, as set forth in 67 Pa. Code §§ 201.81 and 201.82.
- E. Pursuant to Sections 6102(b) and 6109(b)(1) of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 6102(b) and 6109(b), the power to impose such restrictions may be exercised solely by ordinance of the Board.
- F. Pursuant to Sections 4902(e) and 6109(c) of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 4902(e) and 6109(c), upon adoption of such ordinance, appropriate signage must be erected in accordance with departmental regulations.
- G. The Board does intend to comply with all statutory and regulatory provisions in ordaining such restrictions.

**§ 190-21 Weight restrictions established; signage; studies to be kept on file.**

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate an over-posted-weight vehicle upon a posted highway unless such vehicle is an exempt vehicle.
- B. Alexander Spring Road (T-469) weight restriction. Alexander Spring Road is declared to be a posted highway as follows:
  - (1) The Board has received a vehicle weight restriction study conducted by Township Engineer, David Black Associates, Inc., Gregory P. Lambert, P.E., which is entitled "Weight Restriction Study for T-469 Alexander Spring Road."
  - (2) The study concludes that the imposition of a twelve-ton vehicle weight restriction upon that portion of Alexander Spring Road between the South Middleton Township boundary and Burnt House Road (T-542) is warranted to prevent excessive damage to such road and to prevent unsafe traffic conditions.
  - (3) The Board hereby accepts the findings and conclusions of the study and imposes a twelve-ton weight limit on Alexander Spring Road.
- C. Burnt House Road (T-542) weight restriction. Burnt House Road is declared to be a posted highway as follows:
  - (1) The Board has received a vehicle weight restriction study conducted by Township Engineer, RETTEW Associates, Inc., Robert M. Lauriello, P.E., which is entitled "Burnt House Road –

Pavement Analysis/Weight Restriction in Dickinson Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania."

- (2) The study concludes that the entire length of Burnt House Road should be restricted to prohibit trucks having either a gross vehicle weight in excess of 12 tons or having a weight of more than six tons per axle is warranted to prevent excessive damage to such road and to prevent unsafe traffic conditions.
  - (3) The Board hereby accepts the findings and conclusions of the study and imposes a twelve-ton vehicle weight limit and a six-ton per axle weight limit on Burnt House Road.
- G. The Township Public Works Department is hereby directed to erect and maintain signage, in full compliance with all applicable regulations, on and upon the posted highways. With respect to Alexander Spring Road, it is further directed to erect and maintain required signage at the intersection of Alexander Spring Road with Allen Road, which intersection is within the Township of South Middleton. Consent to erection of such signage in South Middleton Township has heretofore been obtained from its authorities.
- H. The Township Secretary is hereby directed to place and retain on file each weight restriction study until such time as the particular weight restriction is removed by further ordinance of the Board.

**§ 190-22 Violations and penalties.**

Any person operating an over-posted-weight vehicle or combination upon a posted highway, unless the same shall be an exempt vehicle, shall be guilty of a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$75, except that any person convicted of operating a vehicle with a gross weight in excess of a posted weight shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$150 plus \$150 for each 500 pounds, or part thereof, in excess of 3,000 pounds over the posted weight limit.

## **Article VI**

### **Parking Restrictions**

**§ 190-23 Preamble and policy.**

The foregoing paragraphs or preamble are incorporated herein as the background and policy of this article.

**§ 190-24 Parking and storage of vehicles on streets, cartways or roadways generally.**

- A. Repair work. No person shall park a vehicle on any street or sidewalk for the purpose of repair work except in case of emergency repairs.
- B. Parking of vehicles without current registration tag or inspection sticker. It shall be unlawful for any person to park, upon or along any street or alley in the Township, any vehicle:
  - (1) Not bearing the current registration tag from the state, province, territory or other governmental unit in which such vehicle is registered; and/or
  - (2) In the case of a vehicle registered in Pennsylvania, not bearing the current state inspection sticker.
- C. Displaying or advertising vehicles for sale. No person shall display or advertise a vehicle for sale while parked or stored upon any street or street right-of-way.
- D. Commercial/Business vehicles. Parking or storing of commercial/business vehicles and trailers upon



any street shall be prohibited other than for temporary purposes associated with work being performed by contractors or for deliveries. For safety, contractors must properly use reflective cones to mark off the area and take into account site distance requirements when parking on Township roads.

- E. Storage of vehicles on streets. No person shall store a vehicle upon any street. As used herein, "stored" shall mean the parking of a vehicle in one place upon any street continuously for over 72 hours.
- F. Selling from parked vehicles. No person shall park a vehicle upon any street or street right-of-way for the principal purpose of offering for sale or selling therefrom any goods, wares or merchandise.
- G. Parking of trucks, buses, recreational vehicles and certain other vehicles prohibited on all Township roads and rights-of-way thereof. It shall be unlawful for any person to park, or to allow to remain parked, on any Township road or right-of-way thereof, any vehicle other than a passenger car, passenger truck, or motorcycle. For the purpose of this section, passenger cars and passenger trucks shall be 10,000 pounds or less gross vehicle weight.

**§ 190-25 No parking on streets, roadways, cartways.**

It shall be prohibited to park or place any motor vehicle or other mode of transportation or object or structure on the paved portion of any of the following streets located in Dickinson Township other than the temporary exceptions listed in 190-24.D.:

### **§ 190-27 Signs.**

The Public Works Department is hereby authorized to place restrictive signs designating the areas described above in accordance with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

### **§ 190-28 Safety Hazards; towing.**

- A. Any person who owns, operates, or parks a vehicle that interferes with the normal movement of traffic or creates a safety hazard shall promptly cause the vehicle to be moved so as to eliminate the interference or hazard. In the event the owner is unable, unwilling or otherwise fails to promptly remove the vehicle, the person shall be deemed to have authorized Dickinson Township or its contractor to act as the person's agent to promptly remove the vehicle on the person's behalf to a place of storage, and such person shall be liable to the person providing the removal and storage services for the cost thereof.
- B. The Township shall promptly send notice by certified mail to the last registered owner of the vehicle advising where the vehicle is located and that it may be reclaimed upon payment of costs. If the abandoned motor vehicle does not bear an identifiable registration plate, current certificate of inspection or vehicle identification number plate, the notice may be secured to the vehicle.
- C. The owner of the vehicle shall have the right to a hearing before the Board of Supervisors if the owner claims that the vehicle was parked legally.

### **§ 190-29 Prohibited parking.**

Parking shall be prohibited on any Township streets whenever snow, ice, sleet, freezing rain, or a combination thereof accumulates on said streets sufficiently to constitute a complete covering of said streets or whenever the Township, at its sole discretion, declares a snow or ice emergency. Information on the existence of a snow or ice emergency shall be given by the Township through radio, newspaper or other available media, and information of the termination of the emergency may be given by use of the same media.

### **§ 190-30 Removal of vehicles; costs.**

In the event a motor vehicle is parked on a highway right-of-way in violation of this article, the Township Board of Supervisors or its designee, including the Roadmaster, or any Police Department with jurisdiction within the Township shall remove or cause the removal of such motor vehicle to a place designated by the Township. Prior to the owner of such motor vehicle regaining possession of said vehicle, or upon assessment of a penalty pursuant to § 190-32 of this article, the owner shall pay to the Township the costs incurred by the Township in causing such removal and storage, and in addition thereto, pay to the Township the penalty prescribed by § 190-32 of this article.

### **§ 190-31 Township not liable for damage.**

The Township, its employees, representatives and contractors shall have no liability for any damage to any motor vehicle parked in violation of this article, occurring to such motor vehicle by reason of Township's removal of such vehicle from its parking location, and/or by reason of the Township's road maintenance and/or snow removal activities or operations.

### **§ 190-32 Parking violations and penalties.**

Penalty for violation. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof before a District Justice, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$75 and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment in the Cumberland County Prison for not more than five days

**§ 190-33 Continuation of existing regulations.**

The provisions of this article, so far as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately prior to the enactment of this article, are intended as a continuation of such ordinances and not as new enactments. The provisions of this article shall not affect any act done or liability incurred, nor shall they affect any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted to enforce any of those repealed ordinances or regulations.

**Article VII**  
**Unlawful Acts**

**§ 190-34 Unlawful to operate motor vehicles or tractors on highways closed for construction or repair.**

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any vehicle or tractor upon any highway in the Township that is under construction, resurfacing or repair, in disregard of any official sign, barricade or notice that the same is closed to vehicular traffic. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$25 and costs of prosecution, or, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to undergo imprisonment for one day for each \$10 of such fine and costs.

**Article VIII**  
**Nonmotorized Vehicles**

**§ 190-35 Restrictions on use of pushcarts.**

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to propel a pushcart upon any sidewalk in any business district except as necessary to move the pushcart to a location from which it is to be loaded or unloaded or from which goods, wares or merchandise are to be sold or dispensed under permit from the Township as provided in Subsection B of this section.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to park a pushcart upon any sidewalk except for the purpose of selling or dispensing from that pushcart goods, wares or merchandise to passersby under permit from the Township. Every such permit shall be issued to the person making application for the permit, upon payment of a fee, which shall be for the use of the Township as set by resolution. The permit shall be granted to the applicant, upon payment of the fee, and upon the applicant signing an agreement with the Township that he/she shall be bound by the conditions imposed by the Township and made a part of the permit, dealing with the following matters:
  - (1) Restricting or limiting the parking of the pushcart to one or more stated locations upon the sidewalk and to stated days and hours at each location.
  - (2) Stating requirements to be adhered to in connection with the disposal of garbage and refuse resulting from the operations carried on.
  - (3) Requiring that there be no violation of any law, ordinance or regulation pertaining to health, sanitation and the handling of food or drink.
- C. Any person who violates any provision of this section, or any condition of any permit granted under

this section, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$50 and costs.

## **Article IX**

### **Pedestrians**

#### **§ 190-36 Pedestrians to obey traffic-control signs.**

At all locations in the Township where official traffic-control signals are installed, pedestrians, except where directed otherwise by pedestrian-control signals installed under § 190-37 of this article, shall obey the directions of those traffic-control signals, as follows:

- A. When facing a green signal, a pedestrian may proceed across the roadway within a crosswalk.
- B. When facing a steady yellow signal, a pedestrian shall not start to cross the roadway.
- C. When facing a steady red signal, a pedestrian shall not enter the roadway.

#### **§ 190-37 Pedestrian-control signal locations.**

- A. At the following locations, official pedestrian-control signals shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected):

**Intersection**

- B. Every pedestrian facing a steady or flashing "Don't Walk" signal shall obey the directions of that signal, as follows:
  - (1) When facing a steady "Don't Walk" signal, a pedestrian shall not start to cross the roadway in the direction of the signal, but any pedestrian who has partially completed his crossing on the "Walk" signal should proceed to a sidewalk or safety zone while the "Don't Walk" signal is showing.
  - (2) When facing a flashing "Don't Walk" signal, a pedestrian shall not start to cross the roadway in the direction of the indication, but any pedestrian who has partly completed crossing during the "Walk" indication should proceed to a sidewalk or safety zone.
- C. Any pedestrian who fails to obey the directions of a "Don't Walk" signal, as indicated above, shall be guilty of an offense and a violation of this article.

#### **§190-38 Parking violations and penalties.**

Any pedestrian who violates any provision of this article shall be guilty of a summary offense and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$50 and costs.
