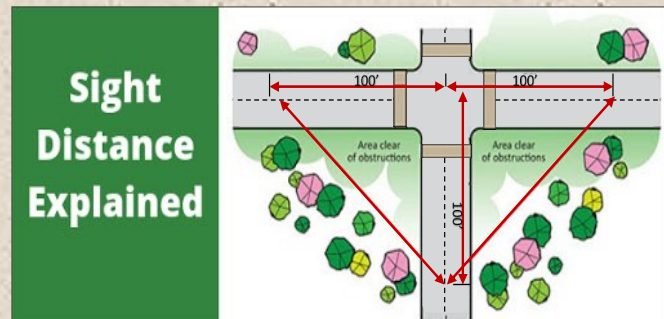

CLEAR SIGHT TRIANGLES

As per Dickinson Township Zoning Ordinance Chapter 205-22A: Corner Lots: No obstruction to vision exceeding 30" in height above street level shall be erected or maintained within a 100' clear sight triangle formed by the centerline of intersecting streets. Due to the safety concerns this could cause when pulling out of intersections, this Ordinance will be enforced.

Friends of Barnitz Mill

History and the Case for Preservation

Barnitz Mill has a long and dynamic history beginning in the 18th century with the Weakley family who were prominent Cumberland County landowners and citizens in the late 18th and early 19th centuries, to include the land where Barnitz Mill now stands. James Weakley operated several mills on the site, to include a fulling, grist and saw mill. It is believed the original mill was situated across the Yellow Breeches Creek from where the current mill is located. In 1834, the business was sold to Ulysses G. Barnitz. The Barnitz family operated the mills well into the 20th century, to include a clover and cooper's mill, a cider press, and at one point a distillery.

Preservation of significant historic structures is an ongoing issue for property owners and depends upon a plan for funding major repairs as well as maintenance. Funds from a grant from the G.B. Stuart Foundation provided for the restoration and stabilization of the building in 1999, but preservation is never achieved in perpetuity and every new generation faces the need to renew preservation efforts. The structure is in deteriorating condition. The stone walls on the lowest level of the mill will need to be stabilized before any additional restoration can proceed.

A Friends of Barnitz Mill (FOBM) group has formed to work with the Township and community to determine what appropriate use might be for the building and put a plan together to restore and maintain it for that purpose. The building location in Stuart Park, which is owned and maintained by the Township, makes it an ideal gathering place for park users, including those interested in nature observation along the trails in the park, people interested in fishing and recreating on the Yellow Breeches Creek, and those who live in the area looking for a gathering place for community activities in a rural, natural setting. If the building were able to accommodate some modest use, it would help with funding the upkeep of the structure. Parks & Recreation News -

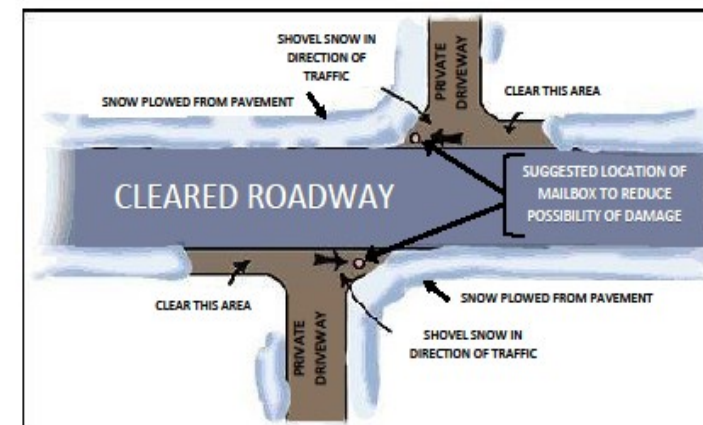

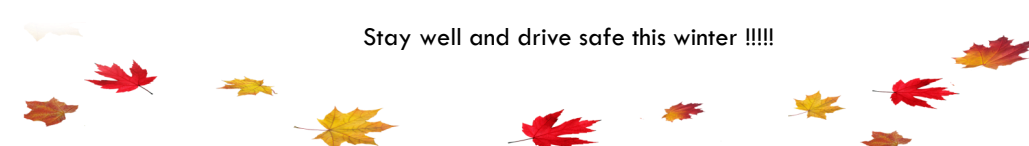

Driveway permits are required for new driveways and existing driveways being resurfaced if it connects to a public road. These driveways must be constructed to allow water to drain off before entering onto a roadway. Permits must be obtained before any work can begin.

Septic Pumping/Inspection Reminder

The Township staff has forwarded the second pumping reminders of the year in September to residents who still need their septic systems pumped in 2023. It is required that every owner of an individual sewage system have septage or other solids removed from the treatment tank at least once every 3 years. Proof of pumping and/or inspection shall be provided by the owner of the individual system within 30 days of the date of service to the Township, along with the required \$10 septic inspection fee, which helps to offset administrative costs. Please visit www.dickinsontownship.org for more information, including required forms and a list of approved septic haulers.

The alternative is to have a Registered Septic Hauler or Inspection Company perform a “sludge test” to verify there is no more than 1/3 of the capacity of the tank filled with solids. If this is the case, you will receive a waiver from the pumping requirements until the next 3 year cycle. A report must be submitted for the solids inspection, along with the \$10 inspection fee.

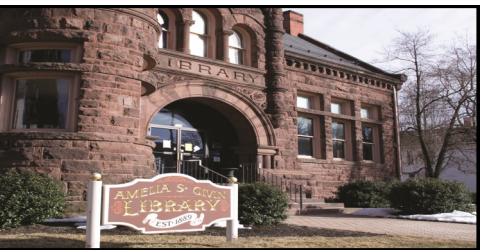
