RESOLUTION NO. 2024-10

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF DICKINSON, CUMBERLAND COUNTY,
PENNSYLVANIA, MAINTAINING THE TEMPORARY BURN BAN INSTITUTED BY
THE TOWNSHIP FIRE ADMINSTRATOR.**

WHEREAS, the Township of Dickinson, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania (the “Township”), is a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, Section 1506 of the Pennsylvania Second Class Township Code, 53 P.S. §§ 65101, *et seq.*, provides that the Township is authorized to make regulations as may be necessary for the health and welfare of the Township and its citizens, trade, commerce, and manufacturers; and

WHEREAS, Section 75-11 of the Code of the Township of Dickinson (the “Code”) authorizes the Township fire or emergency officials to institute a temporary ban on all burning which shall expire no later than the next duly convened meeting of the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the Township Emergency Service Administrator is the duly appointed Township fire official; and

WHEREAS, Section 75-11 of the Code authorizes the Board of Supervisors, by resolution, to maintain such ban, in whole or in part, or to discontinue such ban at the next duly convened meeting of the Board of Supervisors following the institution of a temporary burn ban by the Township Emergency Service Administrator; and

WHEREAS, the extended absence of precipitation has created extensively dry conditions throughout the Township; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 75-11 of the Code, the Township Emergency Service Administrator instituted a temporary burn ban on October 31, 2024, which burn ban shall expire at the next duly convened meeting of the Board of Supervisors on November 18, 2024; and

WHEREAS, in order to best protect the public and private property alike in addition to Township fire resources, the Board of Supervisors of Dickinson Township has determined it is necessary for the health and welfare of the Township and its citizens, to maintain the temporary burn ban instituted by the Township Emergency Service Administrator, in part, prohibiting only uncontained burning.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Dickinson Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, as follows.

SECTION 1: The above recitals are incorporated herein by reference thereto and made a part of this Resolution.

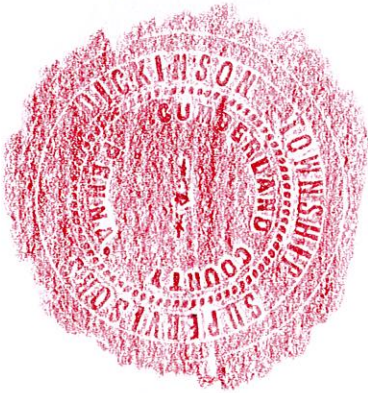
SECTION 2: The Board of Supervisors of Dickinson Township hereby maintains the temporary burn ban instituted by the Township Emergency Service Administrator, in part, prohibiting only uncontained burning, which temporary burn ban shall continue for thirty (30) days from the date hereof unless discontinued by resolution at the next duly convened meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Dickinson Township.

SECTION 3: All provisions of previous resolutions or ordinances which are contrary to this Resolution are expressly repealed.

SECTION 4: If any sentence, clause, section, or part of this Resolution is for any reason found unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality, or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections, or parts hereof. It is hereby declared the intent of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Dickinson that this Resolution would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid sentence, clause, section, or part thereof not been included therein.

SECTION 5: This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

DULY ADOPTED, pursuant to the authority granted to the Township of Dickinson under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in lawful session duly assembled on this 18th day November, 2024.
